2. North Yorkshire Council

Cllr Les- The Council Tax is to rise by 4.99% in the next financial year.

The amount each Councillor has to spend in their Locality Budget Grants is to be reduced from £10,000 to £5,000

3. Matters arising

The Clerk has been in touch with MacPlant to see when they can start the kerb work around the village green. They are still waiting for the delivery of the setts

4. Beck Side erosion.

Cllr Wyrill is still waiting to receive quotes for repairs to the beckside erosion.

Cllr Oselton thinks that rats are causing problems in the bank of the beck as he has seen a lot of rat holes and he thinks this may be causing the banks to collapse. The Clerk will contact Pest Control at North Yorkshire Council

5. Correspondence

a) The Clerk has had an email enquiring whether they could put a memorial plaque on the bench on Low Green.

Cllr Oselton has been looking into repairing this bench. He is getting a quote to use hardwood to replace the rotten planks.

The Parish Council does not have a policy about putting extra plaques on memorial benches that have been bought by families. The family of Mr Toas has not been contactable yet. It was decided that at the moment the Parish Council could not allow another plaque to be placed on the bench. The Clerk will contact the resident.

- b) A resident has contacted the clerk asking if the war memorial on Low Green could be cleaned moss and lichen is growing on it and making it difficult to read. Cllr Campbell said that cleaning of the memorial has to be done carefully so no further damage is caused to the stone and inscriptions. The Clerk will look into this and get some advice.
- c) The Clerk has received an email from a resident about Avian flu. She attached an article from the RSPB that recommends that wild ducks and other species are not fed as this can increase the risk of infection as it can encourage them to gather together. She wondered if the Parish Council could put out any information to try and discourage feeding. It was decided that the Clerk will get some official government guidelines and Cllr Claypole will put this on Facebook.
- d) A resident has asked the Clerk if the leaves on the pavement in front of the old Angel pub and along the length of that footpath could be cleared up as they get slippy in wet weather. The Clerk has contacted street scene from the Council who said they would be able to do it in the near future. This now has been cleaned. The residents also thanked the Parish Council for the work they do for the village.
- e) The Clerk has received an email from the Parks and Ground Manager at North Yorkshire Council to say that in the future they will be able to not only inspect the equipment but also offer repairs. They will be able to provide a quote on an ad hoc basis. This would be useful if only one piece of equipment needs repairing.

6. Planning

ZD25/00042/DIS - Discharge of conditions 5, 7, 8, 15, 18, 19, 22 and 23 attached to planning permission 16/00315/OUT

LOCATION: Land North West Of Manor House Low Green Catterick Village

The Councillors discussed this discharge of conditions —especially the foul water drainage. One of the Councillors lives at Chapmans Court and said that the drainage there is already not that good. Cllr Campbell said that the sewage system for the houses at the bottom of Bishop's Way has still not been sorted out. The Clerk will send a reply to the planning department wanting assurances that the sewage system is installed correctly and adequate for the new houses.
